



Ewald Nowotny, Governor of the Oesterreichische Nationalbank (OeNB) and Member of the Governing Council of the European Central Bank (ECB). Before taking on his current position in September 2008, Ewald Nowotny held a number of high-level positions in financial

institutions. He was CEO of the Austrian BAWAG P.S.K. banking group from 2006 to 2007, served as Vice-President and Member of the Management Committee of the European Investment Bank (EIB) in Luxembourg from 1999 to 2003, and, between 1971 and 1979, was first a Member and then President of the Governing Board of Österreichische Postsparkasse (P.S.K.). Moreover, from 1992 to 2008, Ewald Nowotny served on the supervisory boards of several banks and corporations and was a member of the OeNB's General Council from 2007 to 2008. Ewald studied law and political science at the University of Vienna and economics at the Institute for Advanced Studies (IHS) in Vienna. In 1967, he received his doctorate in law from the University of Vienna. He served as a professor at the University of Linz and at the Vienna University of Economics and Business, where he was also Vice-Rector for Financial Affairs. Ewald was Vice President of the Austrian Economic Association and is a Member of the University Board of the Vienna University of Economics and Business.



Henk Esselink, Head of section joined the Directorate Banknotes of the ECB in 2001, after having worked in the Currency Policy Department of De Nederlandsche Bank in Amsterdam for three years. In 2011 and 2012 he worked in the Directorate General Payments and Market

Infrastructure on issues related to the establishment of the Single Euro Payments Area (SEPA) and innovations in retail payments. Thereafter he returned to the Directorate Banknotes where he now holds the post of Head of the Issue and Circulation Section. He has a master's degree in business administration, and in law & finance.



Rüdiger Voss, Head of section, Euro protection and euro cash, European Commission, Brussels. Rüdiger joined the Directorate-General Economic and Financial Affairs in 2011 where he deals with euro cash policy, including crossborder CIT, EU monetary agreements,

euro coins, cash protection, cash efficiency, and future of cash. Rüdiger is qualified as judge in a court of law and earned a Ph.D. in Economics.

PANEL 1: ACCESS TO CASH – THE SWEDISH LESSONS



Andrea Nitsche has been Chair of the Global Cash Alliance Committee at the International Currency Association (ICA) since the ICA's inception in 2016. She launched the ICA's Cash Matters movement together with Gerben van Wijk and is one the driving forces behind it.

"Keeping Cash – Assessing the Arguments about Cash and Crime" was the first white paper published by Cash Matters. Andrea worked in various industries, always in communications with a focus on media relations and crisis communication. She also taught at a Canadian university and used to live in Berlin and Brussels, representing German energy companies. Currently, she is Director of Communications at G+D Currency Technology and lives in Munich. Andrea holds an M.A. in Liberal Arts from the University of Tübingen.



Ragnar Olofsson is Secretary at the Parliamentary Committee of Inquiry on the Riksbank. Formerly he served 10 years as Deputy Director at the Swedish Ministry of Finance with inter alia the Swedish budgetary framework, government lending and guarantees and

negotiations on the fiscal policy framework at the EUlevel. He has co-authored OECD reports on budgetary systems and has served as a lecturer in Medium-term budgeting courses at the Centre of Excellence in Finance in Ljubljana.



Niklas Arvidsson is Associate Professor at the Royal Institute of Technology and a Ph.D. from Stockholm School of Economics. His research focuses on innovation in the payment system via projects on merchants' views on cash, disruptive technologies in payments and

the cashless society. He is teaching strategy, innovation and leadership.





Staffan Nilsson - Since 2013 he has been one of the two chairmen at Rural Sweden. During many years, he has been a member and chairman of the European Economic & Social Committee. Additionally, he is the chairman of the European Rural

Community Alliance (ERCA). Staffan's main interests are European Policy, civil society and democracy. With humour and insight, he deals with all kinds of rural issues!



Lars Johansson has 44 years of experience in the Swedish Police Force. In 1974, Lars Johansson graduated from the Police Academy in Stockholm County and started his career as a police officer patrolling cars. In 1986 Lars was appointed investigator working

with organised crimes after which he moved on to a unit responsible for investigating armed robberies in Stockholm county. In 1995, Lars joined the newly established Crime Intelligence Unit, an initiative started by the Stockholm County. Lars continued working as an Intelligence Officer, with an intelligent education from the Metropolitan Police, and as a specialist in the field of robberies until his recent retirement in 2018. Besides the duties at the Crime Intelligence Unit, Lars worked part-time with different informers. Lars Johansson is dedicated to Jujutsu and holds the level of a black belt.
