I. Modified Regulation 1338/2001

- Key definitions (Counterfeiting; Counterfeit notes and coins; Competent national authorities)
- Procedures on technical and statistical data
- Obligations for
 - ■National authorities (to transmit counterfeits)
 - ■Credit institutions + other economic agents
- Cooperation and mutual assistance
- Regulation 1339/2001 extends effects to MS which are not in the euro area

I. Article 6 as modified by R. 44/2009

- Broader range of addressees
 - Credit institutions
 - Other payment service providers
 - Institutions engaged in the processing and distribution to the public of notes and coins, including:
 - ■Bureaux de change



- Transporters of funds
- Other (casinos, ATMs)



I. Article 6 as modified by R. 44/2009

Obligation for Institutions to



- Check the authenticity of euro notes and coins before putting them back into circulation
- Withdraw from circulation suspected counterfeit euro notes and coins
- Hand them over to the competent national authorities

I. Procedures for implementing Article 6

Banknotes

Decision of the European Central Bank on the authenticity and fitness checking and recirculation of euro banknotes

(ECB/2010/14)

Coins

Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council concerning authentication of euro coins and handling of euro coins unfit for circulation



II. Authentication of euro coins

- Authentication carried out by
 - ■Coin processing machines
 included at the time of purchase in the
 list published by the Commission

(Transitional periods possible for machines already in use)

Trained personnel (manually)



II. Authentication of euro coins

- Institutions shall ensure that machines are regularly adjusted
- MS shall perform on-the-spot controls to
 - Check machines on a rotating basis
 - Obtain assurance that personnel is duly trained
 - Monitor the authentication capacity of institutions
- Commission/ETSC shall define
 - technical specifications for detection test
 - Training practices, guidelines for controls etc.



II. Handling of unfit euro coins

- Detection of coins unfit for circulation ð a 'by-product' of the authentication process
- MS shall
 - ■reimburse or replace unfit euro coins (unless deliberate/reasonably expectable alteration)
 - destroy unfit euro coins to avoid recirculation
- Specific packaging requirements
- Handling fees may be applicable (exemptions in cases of close and regular cooperation with the national authorities)

II. Reporting obligations

- Institutions shall provide MS upon request with information on
 - Types, number and location of machines
 - ■Volume of coins processed per machine, per year and per denomination (EUR 2, EUR 1, EUR 0,50)
- MS shall report annually to the Commission on their coin authentication activities
- Commission/ETSC shall report
 - annually to Economic and Financial Committee
 - ■By 30 June 2014 to Parliament and Council on the operation and effects of the new Regulation



II. Timeline

- New Regulation to be published by end 2010
- Provisions on unfit coins apply from entry into force (20 days after publication)
- Provisions on coin authentication apply from 1 January 2012 + transitional periods



III. Modified Regulation 2182/2004

- Prohibits the production, sale etc. of medals and tokens similar to euro coins, when:
 - "euro", "euro cent" or "€" on the surface
 - size inside limits for dimensions and metal properties
 - design similar to
 - any design
 - or parts thereof (including 12 stars, map, numerals)



- symbols of national sovereignty (as) appearing on euro coins
- The Commission
 - specifies whether a medal or token falls within the prohibition
 - may allow derogations by authorisation



IV. New status of Europol

- Council Decision 2005/511/JHA & Europol designated as the Central Office for combating euro counterfeiting
- Council Decision 2009/371/JHA ð Europol established as an entity of the Union (EU agency)
 - Funded by general EU budget
 - Increased accountability
 - Improved organisational flexibility and effectiveness
