# ESTA EXTERNAL AFFAIRS

#### CoESS

The CoESS CIT Working Committee has met in Brussels on March 23<sup>rd</sup> under the Presidency of Mr. Bernard Dumoulin and reviewed all CIT legal environment and development.

## CEN/DIN TASK FORCE SECURITY SERVICES (CEN/BT/TF167)

During their third meeting in London, on March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2005, decision has been made to undertake a technical debate on consensus oriented work on terminology relevant for security service providers (instead of standardization).

## CEN/ TC263 (PAS 40) ON CASH DEGRADATION SYSTEMS

ESTA's application for observer status has been approved and a first meeting (kick-off) has taken place in Paris on January 26<sup>th</sup>, 2005. Future meetings will tackle the various aspects of this upcoming standardization.

# EUROPEAN INSTITUTIONS

# INTERNAL MARKET – DIRECTIVE SERVICES

We have come to the conclusion that the Commission is unlikely to oppose a casino-like provision for security services (derogation limited the harmonization instrument) and is open to an extension of Article 18 (1) (a) to the entire security business rather than just CIT.

In the meantime we continue lobbying all stakeholders.

## ECB – RECYCLING FRAMEWORK

ECB has positively replied to most of ESTA's remarks regarding recycling by organisations other than credit institutions and professional cash handlers, who should also comply with the same standards. Banknote handling machines' settings will be published on the ECB/NCBs websites and NCBs will be mandated to check whether the banknote handling machines used and the related organisational procedures are in compliance with the rules of the framework.

Finally on theft deterrent systems, ECB shares our view that this issue deserves due consideration – (see below).

# ECB – THEFT DETERRENT SYSTEMS (TDS)

ECB has launched an ad-hoc activity team with a mandate to conduct a technical survey on the existing technologies of TDS and the perceived trends including the degree of penetration of these TDS in the CIT operations as well as ATM protection.

Two meetings already took place and conclusions should be finalized shortly.

## NEW LEGAL FRAMEWORK FOR PAYMENTS IN THE INTERNAL MARKET

A recent meeting with the Commission has brought several replies to our questions:

- Is the CIT Industry concerned? Cash is only concerned when converted in scriptural money and CIT services are deemed to be "ancillary service", on behalf of a bank. Generally speaking our industry is not concerned with one possible exception (under current examination) when services are rendered to a non-bank business (i.e. ATM independent operator).
- Value date: The Commission is fully aware of the obligations mandated by the ECB framework and is of the opinion that this is not an issue for CIT but for the banks.
- > Cash issues:

The Commission is striving towards efficiency of payments and has concluded that cash/paper payments are more expensive than E-payments.

ESTA's position is that cash is a very efficient means of payment, preferred by the consumer, and can be less expensive through re-engineering of the cash cycle. Furthermore seignorage revenue is very likely to offset cash costs and must be factored in any economical analysis (as established by various Central Banks reports). ESTA will shortly formally present and circulate its Position Paper on this issue.
