A. The Eurosystem mission on cash

- Ensuring a smooth and efficient supply of euro cash
- Maintaining the integrity of the euro
- Contributing to a level playing field in the euro cash area
- No "one-size-fits-all" cash supply model
- Transitional periods for implementation of measures for more convergence

BI. Convergence of NCBs' cash services

Several NCB cash services harmonised in 2002

- fee policy for cash transactions
- minimum opening hours
- minimum sorting standards
- Road map for more convergence in NCBs' cash services adopted in 2007
- Further convergence in the organisation of cash services requires certain flexibility of all stakeholders

B II. Road map for more convergence of cash services

- I. Measures implemented or decided
- Remote access to NCBs' cash services implemented by all Eurosystem NCBs in 2007
- Coin lodgements possible in all Eurosystem NCBs as of 2008

Non-faced and non-orientated lodgements and withdrawals will be common free-of-charge service as of Jan 2011

B II. Road map for more convergence of cash services

2. Measures planned

- Electronic data exchange between NCBs and credit institutions for cash lodgements and withdrawals
- Common banknote packaging standards for NCB free of charge cash services

C. The Banknote Recycling Framework (I)

Banknote recycling outside the NCBs governed by the ECB's Banknote Recycling Framework (BRF) since 2004

- to ensure level playing field as well as good quality and authenticity of banknote circulation

Banks supply their customers via ATMs with banknotes received from ...

- an NCB
- recycled" banknotes processed with sorting equipment successfully tested by the Eurosystem
 - the list of successfully tested machines is published on the ECB's and the NCBs' websites

C. The Banknote Recycling Framework (II)

Consequences of Council Regulation (EC) No. 44/2009 of 18/12/2008, amending *Article 6 of Regulation (EC) No.* 1338/2001 for the application of the BRF

• *Obligation to check* the authenticity of banknotes to be recycled in accordance with the ECB's BRF

• Widening the scope of addressees to "other economic agents"
